<u>Music</u> The music curriculum is led by our specialist music teachers who work closely, not only with children, but with adults in school to raise self-esteem and confidence with areas such as singing. Children have the opportunity to learn as part of our brass group, ukulele playing is learned and we have a wide range of percussion instruments. Children love singing and teachers successfully use learned strategies across other subjects. Assemblies, concerts and performances which include music are of high quality.

Drama

Drama is given a high priority and through delivery of lessons, supporting visitors, educational visits and performances, children have access to working with professionals and children from other schools. This can mean experiencing what it is like to perform on stage at the Globe Theatre in London, putting together an act for a talent show, or performing a puppet show as part of a Mayan history topic. We have worked with the Theatre Royal, Norwich, Samantha Dann the children's author and delved into the depths of history with 'Inquisiquest'. We dress for the occasion and experience times gone by! Tudor Banquets and Battles, Victorian School Days and

the story of The Gingerbread Man and the Snow Queen have all been witnessed in our school.

Recently, our involvement in The Shakespeare Schools Festival, sees Year 4 and 5 staging their own version of Macbeth on the stage at The Theatre Royal, Bury St. Edmunds.

Art

What is Art? We asked the children... 'It's about being able to express your own thoughts and ideas in lots of different ways' answered a 7 year old. 'You can paint, sing or draw it', said another. We say, look around our school and see how Art supports learning across the curriculum. See it, hear it, do it....learn it!

We ensure displays of children's work are current and relevant to their learning. We value their achievements and want them to be proud of them. Whether it be learning sketching techniques, using art to understand concepts of maths, or our dazzling discoveries art work in science. Art enables everyone to have ago, in their own way and in their own time.

Children support each other through being Art Leaders at clubs and staff use skills to teach subjects that they are strong in.
